FUND DESCRIPTION

Investment Objective: The Horizon Managed Risk ETF seeks to capture the majority of U.S. large-cap equity market returns while mitigating downside risk through a "Risk Assist®" strategy.

The Managed Risk Fund is an actively managed exchange-traded fund ("ETF") that pursues its objective by combining two complementary strategies: an Equity Strategy and the proprietary Risk Assist® Strategy. Under the Equity Strategy, the Fund primarily invests in large-cap U.S. equity securities identified through a multi-factor selection model emphasizing valuation, momentum, quality, volatility, and sentiment factors. The Risk Assist® Strategy systematically adjusts the Fund's exposure based on real-time volatility signals, reducing equity exposure during periods of elevated market volatility and re-engaging when conditions normalize to participate in market recoveries.

ASPECTS OF THIS ACTIVE FUND

Multi-Factor: Actively selects U.S. large-cap equities using value, momentum, quality, volatility and sentiment screens to capture diverse sources of return.

Flexible: Actively adjusts investments to help take advantage of rising markets while aiming to hedge against losses in downturns.

Risk-Managed: During periods of heightened market risk, the Fund is designed to mitigate downside risk through Risk Assist®, which is an active risk reduction strategy designed to guard against large declines in the Fund's portfolio by investing up to 100% of the portfolio in U.S. Treasuries or other cash equivalents (or in securities that invest in the same).

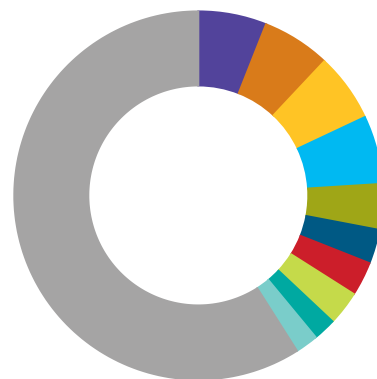

Bloomberg Aggregate Bond Index is a broad-based benchmark that measures the investment grade, U.S. dollar-denominated, fixed-rate taxable bond market.

S&P 500 TR is the Standard & Poor's index calculated on a total return basis. It is widely regarded as the benchmark gauge of the U.S. equities market and includes a representative sample of 500 leading companies in leading industries of the U.S. economy. The S&P 500 Total Return Index (SPTR) is one example of a total return index. The SPTR is different from the standard S&P Index (SPX), which does not include dividend gains. The total return indexes follow a similar pattern in which many mutual funds operate, where all resulting cash payouts are automatically reinvested back into the fund itself.
